Public Sector Apprenticeship Return

Previously all public sector bodies with 250 or more staff had a public sector apprenticeship target to aim towards. Although this measure has been scrapped by the Department for Education, public sector bodies have been asked to continue to collect and report on key apprenticeship data.

Wigan Council's apprenticeship offer continues to go from strength to strength with apprenticeships playing a huge role in helping attract new talent to Wigan, upskill existing staff and help with succession planning and retention. The wealth of standards staff employed as an apprentice and existing staff upskilling via an apprenticeship complete range from Lead Adult Care Worker to Social Worker, Operational Departmental Manager to multi-skilled tradesperson.
