Did you know that recycling and composting rates are continuing to increase thanks to your recycling efforts? We are now recycling and composting 40.9% of waste compared to 7% in 2002/03. However, we still need your help to reach our target of 50% by 2015 and this will generate savings to help district councils protect local services.

Our target is to divert at least 75% of waste from landfill by 2015 and our ultimate aim is zero waste to landfill in Greater Manchester.

The precept for 2013-14 is £38,376,251 which is equivalent to £57.64 for a dwelling in Band D.

Greater Manchester Fire and Rescue Authority took the difficult decision to increase your Council Tax bill this year following further budget cuts. For most people this will be less than 10p per week. We remain among the lowest charging fire and rescue services in England – with most households paying less than £1 per week for the service.

Not increasing the bill, even by a few pence a week, could have led to the loss of 600 front line firefighters and even fire station closures. In addition, our community work - including Prince's Trust schemes, arson reduction initiatives, community sport projects, Cadet groups - and fire prevention activity such as providing free Home Safety Checks and smoke alarms - would have suffered.

We will use the extra money to keep you safe.

As your newly-elected Police and Crime Commissioner, my iob is to hold the chief constable to account and be an effective voice for the people of Greater Manchester.

I also set the police budget each year, including the part of vour council tax that goes towards policing. As you can see in the tables below, the government has significantly reduced the funding available to our police force. These irresponsible cuts mean we have no choice but to ask for a small rise in your contribution.

The increase in the police element of your council tax will be just £5 per year extra on the bill for the average Band D property – that's just over a penny a day. I promise to make sure that this money is used to help Greater Manchester Police continue to have a visible presence on the streets of our neighbourhoods. In total, the police element of your council tax is £149.33 per year or about £2.87 a week. This is one of the lowest in the country.





After listening to the views of people across Greater Manchester, I have set the chief constable the following policing priorities:

- Driving down crime
- Tackling anti-social behaviour
- Protecting vulnerable people
- Putting victims at the centre
- Dealing effectively with terrorism, serious crime and organised criminality
- Dealing with civil emergencies and emerging threats
- Building confidence in policing services
- Protecting police services

Over the coming year I will measure the force's performance to make sure it's delivering on these objectives.

The Precept for 2013-14 is £99,422,718 which is equivalent to £149.33 for a dwelling in Band D, two person equivalent. A comparison of EXPENDITURE AND INCOME for 2012-13 and 2013-14 is as follows:-

This leaflet is published in accordance with the Council Tax (Demand Notices) (England) Regulations 2011.

If, after reading this leaflet, you require clarification on a particular service, simply contact the Department at the address given in the relevant section.

The basis of charging for these services varies as follows:

The Police and Crime Commissioner for Greater Manchester and Fire & Rescue Authority issue a precept based on the number of estimated chargeable dwellings in Greater Manchester. The estimate is called the Tax Base and is expressed as a number of Band D two person equivalent dwellings.

The Waste Disposal Authority charges a levy for the disposal function, apportioned to each of the 9 Constituent Districts, and in 2013-14 this will, in part, be based on tonnage for household arisings and on Council Tax for household waste recycling centre (HWRC) arisings (N.B. Wigan is excluded, as it runs its own

These precepts and levies are then included in each district's total Council Tax levy.

In 2013-2014 the Council Tax Base for Greater Manchester, expressed in terms of Band D two person equivalent dwellings is 665,792 and the resident population is estimated to be 2,722,679.

Wigan Council and Oldham Council are designated "lead district" for Fire and Rescue and Waste Disposal respectively; Senior Finance Officers act as Treasurers to the Authorities. Certain other officers provide a variety of professional and administrative
