## Paying council bills

To fund vital services the council has a duty to collect all the money it is owed.

## If you owe money for a council bill

You may have a bill for many reasons. Your bill / statement will tell you what you have to pay for, how much you owe, when it is due and how you can pay.

You can view and manage your Council Tax bill and your Wigan and Leigh Housing rent account online by registering for your MyAccount at

### www.wigan.gov.uk/MyAccount

Using your MyAccount for Council Tax you can sign up to pay by Direct Debit, make a payment, change your instalment date, tell us about a change and tell us if you are having trouble paying. We can get back to you by email so you don't need to wait in a telephone queue.

## How to pay your council bill?

There are many different ways you can pay. To find out how go to www.wigan.gov.uk/payit

Your bill or statement will also have information about how to pay.

Make sure you quote your correct reference number when making your payment. If you quote the wrong reference, your payment may not reach your account on time.

## Having trouble paying a council bill?

Contact us as soon as you know your payment will be late or you cannot make your payment. Your bill / statement will tell you how to get in touch with us and we can usually help you to agree a payment arrangement and avoid further recovery action. For your Council Tax bill the easiest way to get in touch is through your MyAccount.

Get in touch with those you owe money to as soon as you can. You can nominate a friend or representative to help you if you find it hard to manage it yourself.

- build self reliance.
