Demand for Council housing continues to rise in 2024.

So far this year we have continued to see an increase in demand for Council properties and would like to make customers aware of this so we can better manage expectations.

We now have over 14,000 customers on the Housing Register, with approximately 6,111 customers bidding for properties on a regular basis. Only 1,131 Council properties became vacant last year (1.04.22 – 31.03.23), which is considerably lower compared to previous years when we had around 1600 properties. The average number of bids received for each property is 142 and waiting times have substantially increased, even for those homeless and in urgent housing need.

We ask that you consider alternative housing options if these are available to you, which may include.

- Renting a private property
- Renting a Housing Association property
- Home ownership/affordable home ownership
- A mutual exchange if you are a secure tenant.

There is a diverse range of affordable housing options available on the market which could help you into home ownership. Home swapper - Mutual exchange

A mutual exchange is when you arrange to swap homes with someone else. To apply you must be a secure council tenant or Housing Association tenant and you must have your landlord's written permission before you swap. Mutual exchange can often help tenants to find alternative accommodation quickly.

Wigan Council now subscribes to HomeSwapper, the UK's leading mutual exchange service. If you are a Wigan Council tenant and have been for 12 months or more, you can register and look for potential swaps free of charge.

What is Sheltered Accommodation?

Sheltered accommodation could suit you if you want to live within a scheme in your own home, with your own front door but with the company of other residents, should you want this. To give you peace of mind there is support in place that can be accessed 24/7 via a Scheme manager or a response service. We want sheltered accommodation to be a lively place for residents and the local community where our resident's skills are celebrated, and lives enriched to keep people living independently and well for longer. We have social events that you can access and there are no rules on when you come and go from the scheme.

IHM Charge - what does this cover

To cover the cost of the communal areas and to ensure your security a management fee applies in sheltered accommodation schemes. Many of our sheltered schemes have communal facilities and are therefore subject to the higher fee to pay (maximum £12.23 per week). However, you may be able to get assistance with this fee if you are entitled to housing benefit (maximum £2.84 per week). The fee you pay will depend on which scheme you choose to live in.
