



Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, I am writing to request the following information:

1. Copies of all risk assessments related to health and safety practices on the Haigh Hall railway restoration project including any documentation detailing compliance with national railway standards.
2. Documentation regarding inspections or evaluations of the site for compliance with health and safety regulations, including any findings or reports.
3. Any assessments or plans for the management of Japanese knotweed on the site, including strategies to prevent its spread and associated costs.
4. Details of any legal or regulatory advice received regarding the health and safety requirements for a 15-inch railway and the handling of Japanese knotweed at the site.

The railway is currently not in operation so no risk assessments are in place
