Over the past 12 months Wigan Council have actively been developing and testing GenAI tools to support our core missions under our new era “Progress with Unity.” This refreshed Council Strategy aims to enhance the lives of our residents by fostering greater equity, improving service delivery, and promoting community well-being. Indeed, a key transformation strand set out in the plan is to “Transform the way we operate through technology and AI underpinned by a relentless focus on data and insight.”

AI Projects and Use Cases

6. Extended testing of chatbot functionality. Lots of learning and some great results but platform not quite right and so continuing to trial on a different platform. Pilot of recording and summarising Adult Social Care Supported Self Assessments. Great results but ongoing pilot. Upcoming plans to trial Microsoft 365 Co-pilot with a focussed user group to assess benefits.

7. The GenAI Working Group is our governance group that discuss and consider all use cases. Information Governance colleagues are key to this. The group compliments the work done by our Joint Architecture Group (JAG) who robustly review the security elements of any solutions. Our QuickAction solution uses a governed corpus and only analyses the data that is directly fed into it. This reduces the risk of bias. Our chatbot pilot also used a governed corpus of information, along with a hierarchical approach to which data should be considered as a priority. Our GenAI Policy mandates that human oversight is key and that AI must not be used to make decisions.
